SPIN, the #1 source of funding information, provides institutions and regional economic development efforts with current and available sources of much needed funds and sponsorships. But that's not all. **SPIN** is also integrated with InfoEd's **InfoOfficeTM Proposal Development** electronic proposal preparation and submission module and **InfoOfficeTM Proposal Tracking**. **SPIN** is the most complete, up-to-date and versatile service of its kind!

What should I know about the database?

SPIN currently contains information from more than 1,200 different sponsoring agencies, which together fund over 10,000 separate funding opportunities. All of the information on **SPIN** is obtained directly from the sponsoring agencies to ensure the integrity of the information. Each funding opportunity is updated on **SPIN** as the sponsoring agency comes out with updated or revised information, which is typically on an annual basis. The **SPIN** database is provided through annual subscription to over 600 colleges, universities and industry clients worldwide. It is a computer database with detailed and up-to-the-minute information about thousands of Federal and Non-Federal and International funding opportunities, like...

Are the funding opportunity profiles comprehensive?

The funding opportunity profiles on **SPIN** are extremely comprehensive, providing such information as:

- Sponsor name
- Contact person
- Complete address/telephone
- Deadline dates
- Program title
- Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance number (for US Federal programs)
- A brief Synopsis outlining the opportunity
- PLUS - a detailed description of the sponsor's objectives/what is funded and the program's restrictions, i.e., eligibility requirements, award amounts and duration, allowable costs, indirect cost policies, and application information.

How are the funding opportunity profiles catalogued?

SPIN is designed to give users all of the information they need to decide whether or not to pursue a particular funding opportunity. The InfoEd **SPIN** writing staff codes each funding opportunity based on a variety of criteria, including eligibility, the type of support offered, and discipline(s) of interest (keywords). The **SPIN** Keyword Thesaurus is originally based on the NIH-NSF-DOE Keyword Thesaurus, version 4.0, and is continually enhanced to include hundreds of terms which the InfoEd **SPIN** staff identifies as necessary for a more complete thesaurus.

What can I search on?

The **SPIN** database search engine is very flexible. It enables users to conduct searches on text as well as indexed fields. And it provides for straight keyword searches as well as complex searches involving many keywords and conditions. Results are may be viewed in several pre-defined formats, including: full program, summary, and deadline date
